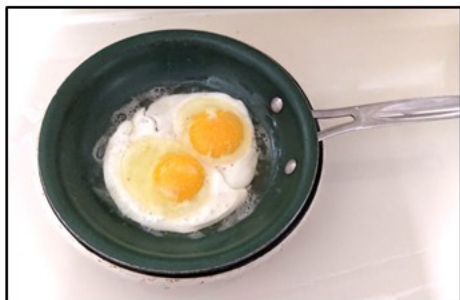
How to Fry an Egg

Definitions of different fried eggs

- Sunny-side up: Yolk (yellow part) is up. Egg is not flipped.
- Over easy: Egg is flipped. Yolk is runny.
- Over medium: Egg is flipped. Yolk is a little runny.
- Over hard: Egg is flipped. Yolk is hard, not runny.

What you need

- eggs
- cooking spray
- a frying pan
- a spatula
- salt
- pepper



Directions

1. Put the pan on the stove. Turn on the stove to medium.
2. Medium is between low and high.
3. Wait a few minutes. The pan will become warm.
4. Spray the pan with cooking spray.
5. Crack an egg into the pan. Use the pan edge or a fork to crack.
6. Add a little salt and a little pepper.
7. Wait three or four minutes. Do not touch the egg.
8. Use your spatula. Slide the spatula under the egg. Flip the egg.
9. Wait for 2 minutes.
10. Slide the egg onto a plate.

Cooking different fried eggs

- Sunny-side up: Do not flip the egg. After step 6, slide egg onto plate.
- Over easy: Step 8, wait only one minute.
- Over hard: Step 8, wait three minutes

The face is eight feet tall.

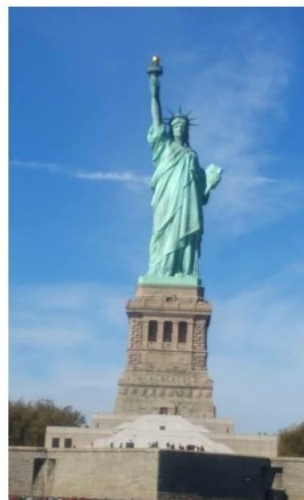
The statue has 354 stairs.

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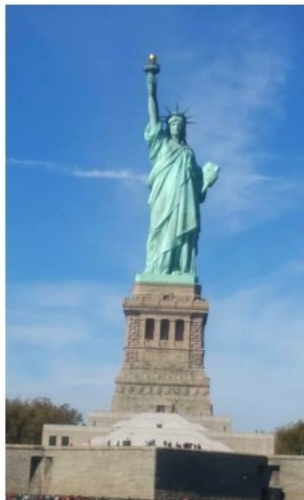
